



Some of the 2026 Featured Speakers



Dr. Gerald Henry is the Athletic Association Endowed Professor of Environmental Turfgrass Science at the University of Georgia. His research focuses on reducing inputs through precision turfgrass management, improving athletic field performance and player safety, weed biology and ecology and ecosystem services.

Dr. J. Scott McElroy is a Professor at Auburn University and has dedicated the majority of his life on earth to killing weeds making grass better for all people. Dr. Scott received his Ph.D. from NC State Univ., worked a stint at the University of Tenn., and has been toiling away at all things turfgrass at Auburn for the last 18 years.



Dr. Travis Gannon is a professor in the Dept. of Crop Science at NC State University and serves as the co-director of the Center of Turfgrass Environmental Research and Education. His research and outreach efforts support the development that balance effective management with environmental sustainability.

Ms. Bre Schoultz took her passion for keeping equipment running to become a true powerhouse in the world of small engine repair. She created the Podcast "Chickanic" that today has one million followers and more than two hundred million views. She breaks down complex repairs into no nonsense tutorials on small engines and more!



Dr. Olga Kostromytska, is an Extension Assistant Professor at the University of Massachusetts with a research program focused on gaining a better understanding of biology and ecology of turfgrass insect pests, developing sustainable management strategies, reduced insecticide applications and investigating resistance mechanisms to identify and solve insect pest problems.

Dr. Mike Fidanza is a Professor of Plant and Soil Science at the Pennsylvania State University (Berks Campus). His research focus includes turfgrass ecology, plant health products, soil surfactants, seed technology, and cultural practices in turfgrass ecosystems.





Research & Innovation

nfortunately, we sometimes work in a profession that can experience death (turf) and destruction. When turf loss occurs, analysis (research) is needed to determine the cause and adjustments (innovations) are warranted to avoid future failures. During our investigation it might be

determined that the loss was unavoidable, a natural occurrence that normally your turf would not be exposed to. It might also show signs of a crack in our protective shield that exposed areas to its own vulnerability. Each day includes factors, good and bad, that can influence turf health. Regardless of the determined cause, how you move forward might be a key to your success. Recovery doesn't just happen, and many steps might be involved. Past challenges and accumulated experiences teach us how to correct our course through turbulent times. Consultation with researchers and peers could be advantageous resources for planning future strategies. Sitting idly and hoping for a better outcome will only guarantee uncertainty and complacency.
